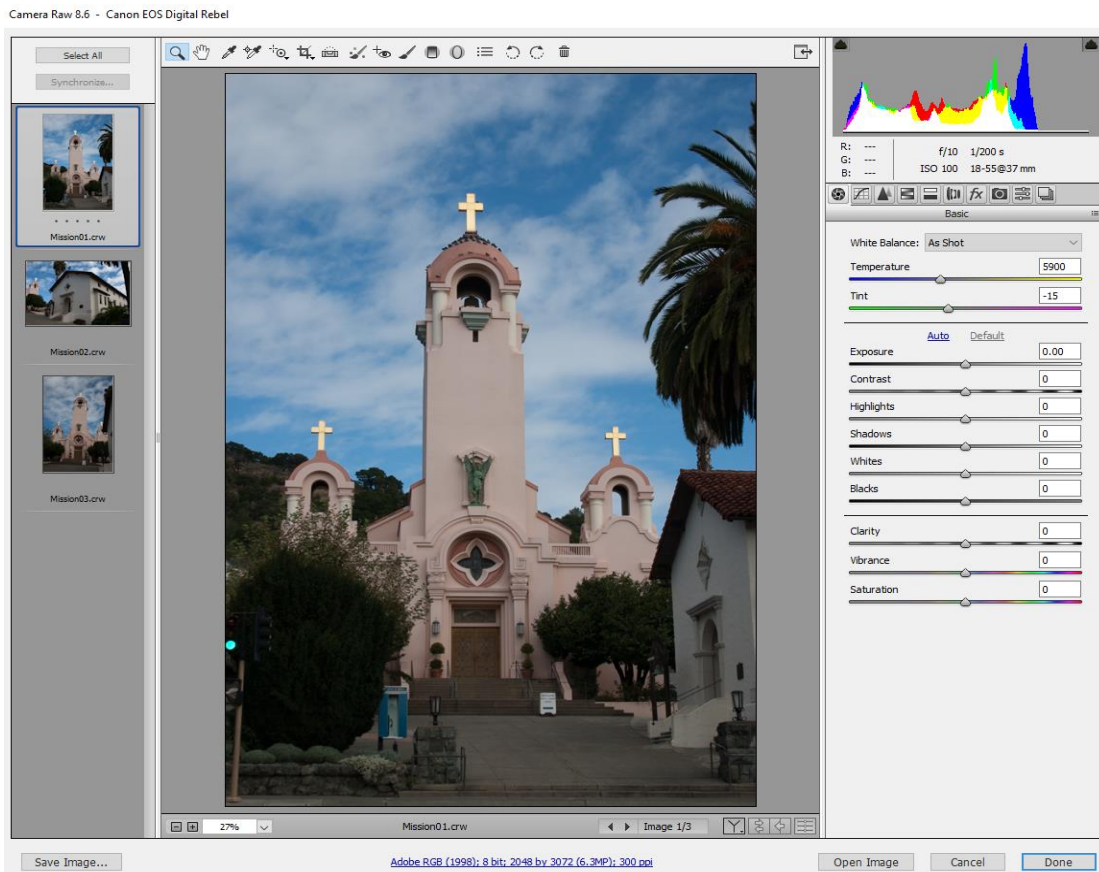


How-to: Correcting and Enhancing Digital Photographs in Photoshop

1. *Open up Photoshop. Go to File > Browse in Bridge.*
2. *Browse for your desired image(s). Click to select image(s), then choose File > Open in Camera Raw.*



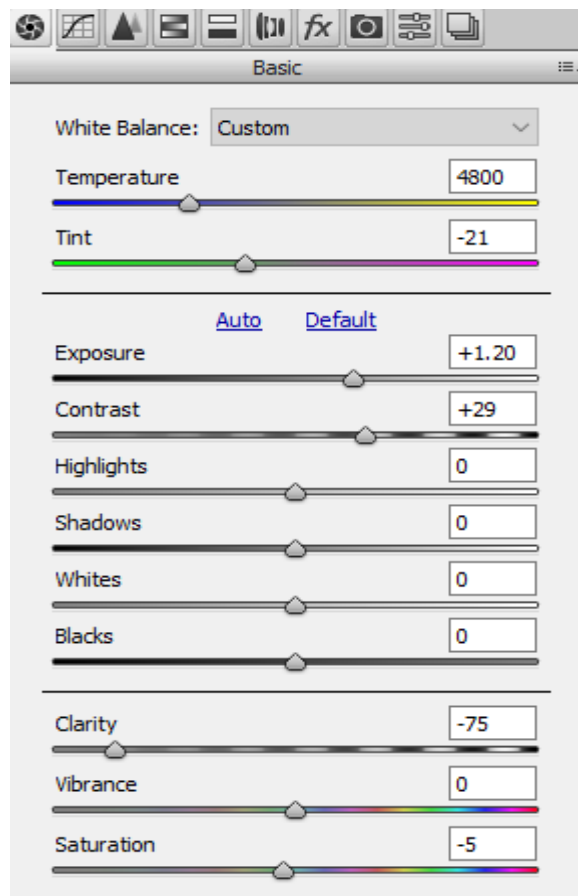
Adjusting White Balance

1. *Select image. On the right side of the dialog box, make sure the Basic button is selected. Then, at the top of the dialog box, select the White Balance tool.*
2. *Click on anywhere in the image. The lighting of the image changes.*
3. *Notice that in the Basics panel, you can choose different options from the White Balance menu for different lighting changes.*

Tonal Adjustments

1. Click on *Auto* in the *Basic* panel.
2. Click on *Default* in the *Basic* panel.
3. Change the sliders as follows (as an example):

- Increase *Exposure* to **+1.20**
- Leave *Brightness* at **50**
- Increase *Contrast* to **+29**
- Decrease *Clarity* to **-75**
- Decrease *Saturation* to **-5**



Sharpening

1. Double-click the zoom tool. Select the *Hand* tool and pan the image to desired location.
2. Click the *Detail* tab to open the *Detail* panel. Make the following changes (as an example):

- *Move the Amount slider to **100***
- *Move Radius slider to **0.9***
- *Move the detail slider to **25**, if it isn't already there*
- *Move the Masking slider to **50***
- *Then Decrease the Amount slider to **50***
